# What is Collar in Sewing

A collar is the part of a garment that frames your neck and offers you great opportunities for design variations. Some collars are seen closer to the neck while others are longer. Collars can be wide, narrow, round and high but can also be pointed and scalloped. Collars can have 2 different styles: convertible or non-convertible. They sit around the neck, but convert to a shorter style when unbuttoned and opened.

# 3 Basic Types of Collars

As earlier, most collars were detachable, but lately they are an integral part of our clothes. Collars can be attached to the garment by sewing or detachable. You can classify them under three basic types of collars – stand collar, roll collar, and flat collar.

- Stand collar the band essentially stands upright, around the wearer's neck.
- The roll collar is another type of collar that starts out as a stand collar which then gets rolled or folded over.
- A flat collar can be worn on the shoulders or tucked in.

Collars are made to frame the neckline and complement the face. Some basic styles are timeless and well known. Collar styles vary in size, cut, placement, fullness and tradition. So, now let's discuss about various styles of collars.

# Various styles of collars

#### **Shirt Collar**



The shirt collar is a flap of fabric on the front of a shirt that fold down over the top part of their shoulder. It should button in some ways or stand up depending on its design but it may also be long and fold down over at least some portion determined by the person. The term "shirt collar" is typically used to describe stand-up collars that you would find on shirts. However, it also applies to other types of collars such as button-downs or turtlenecks.

## **Button Down Collar**



A shirt collar with buttons on the points fastening it to the shirt is called button down collar. On the other hand, a button down shirt is a type of shirt which features a button down collar on its design. They are usually made of a thicker material known as Oxford cloth. Oxford is a type of fabric that was originally made in Scotland and has a rough, woven quality to it. These qualities make the Oxford cloth popular for clothes (like shirts) because it can be durable when put through tough conditions. Oxford cloth is a type of cloth that has a tendency to retain its shape over time. It's generally a lot stiffer than other types of fabric too.

The shirt made with Oxford cloth is called Oxford shirt. Oxford shirts typically have a buttondown collar. This helps it stay in place and prevents it from getting caught underneath your other clothes.

## **Whisk Collar**



Stiff collar with a folded tip that sits at the top of your shoulder and extends to the bottom in a half-moon shape.

The whisk collar was a wide standing collar originally a stiff, ornate chest decoration worn during the first decades of the 17th century in Spain and then evolved to be worn as a neck ornament. It was also popular with many fashion trends of this period.

#### **Shawl Collar**



A shawl collar is a type of collar that is typically found on men's suit jackets and blazers. It is a wide, flat collar that covers the neck and extends down the chest. It is turned down and goes around the neck like a wide lapel (What is a Lapel? The definition is present in the below paragraph). It has the appearance of wrapping up and around like a shawl. Shawl collars are made up of fabric that is wrapped around and drapes over the shoulders. Shawl collars can be made of different materials, such as wool, cotton, or polyester. They can be worn on their own, or as part of a suit jacket.

#### LAPEL

The part on each side of a coat or jacket immediately below the collar which is folded back on either side of the front opening.



A lapel is a fold of cloth on the front of a jacket or coat. The word derives from Old French lappel, meaning "flap," and originally referred only to the part of a garment that folded over the front. In the modern usage the lapel term is referred to the folded flap of cloth on the front of a garment, below the collar.



## **Turtle Neck Collar**

The turtle neck collar is one type of stand-up collar, but the most common neckline to wear in this type of shirt would have is a roll-up or roll-down collar.

# Wing Collar


## **Pointed Flat Collar**

# **Square Neck Collar**



# **Quarter Zip Collar**


